

For Biplob it all started back in 1998 when he tried to join Bangladesh Army as a commissioned officer, but he missed the opportunity. On the other hand, he enjoyed his study but over the time he got married, had two kids and his career choice changed from other to photographer.

He had so far taken part in 15 Sundio Art' based on studio art work his third solo photography exhibition that gone last year.

In the title of 'Studio Art', he did a weeklong exhibition featuring works. The exhibition was held recently at Drik Galley in the city's Dhanmondi area. There he had exhibited 40 photographs. The exhibition earned a new idea in photography where he had used lights and his models are existing in lights.

Just as many fashions have stories behind them, Biplob's intent with his photos is all about story telling. 'I went through this process to find the why behind my business. During that process an image of a campfire



popped up. My art, is simply asking people who stand at the edge of the campfire to sit down and tell their story. I hope my photography makes people smile and challenges perceptons, 'says Biplob.

Before his days in the Photography cancer Biplob got a taste in photography of multimedia design during his high school period. From there has learned most of what he knows through a slow organic process of learning owing much of the success to people who have mentored him along the way, website forums with

other photographers and blogs that he follows. Zahdur Rahman contin-nes, "Back in 2000, I loved the solid community of photographers on Bangladesh Photography Society (BPS) that encouraged one another. Other places that I have benefited from include outing with other Pho-tographers."

In conversation with photographer M. M. Zahidur Rahman Biplob

How do you have come in the photography?
I have a knack for photography from my childhood but I professionally started my career as a photographer from 2003. Though I am doing fashion photography commercially, my favourite subjects include nature and its elements - landscape, lifestyle and wildlife - ranging from a confused squirrel to a successful kingfisher; a boasting butterfly to a twitchy dragonity. The subtle game of light and shadow prevail in almost all the images. 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When you use on the classic sense of photography you need to maintain few grammatical rules and regulation, at first you need to know about the basics of photography like aesthetics and techniques which it fold you before. Then you must know about metering which is related with lighting and how much you will use for a photography. Thirdly, white balance, which is applicable for digital photography and it, will help you to prope goide for color. Fourthly exposure, it is the most important phenomena for shatter and



aperture to control the camera which related with 'ISO'.

How many things a photographer should follow to take a good snap?

Photography itself is an art. It's like paintings. Camera is such a device that whatever you want to make or produce, it comes through your visualization. A photographer must follow three basic important things. To expose subjects and characters; proper lightling is tremendously important for real photography. Other important steps to follow are shadow, midtone and highlight detail. Those

are essential for dimension based and realistic photography correctly. If anybody can do with in proper way then he must increase his imagination then a photographer can construct a good photography.

I have so far taken part in 14 group exhibitions last nine years. Studio Art based on studio art work is my third solo exhibition that gone last month this year.

What was your basic subject matter in last exhibition?

In the title of 'Studio Art', I did a weeklong exhibition featuring works. The exhibition recently (20th October, 2012) ended at Drik Gallery in Dhanmondi, Dhaka. There I had exhibited 40 photographs. The exhibition earned a new idea in photography where I have used lights and my models are existing in lightings. I have taken the help from Photoshop just 5-10% in my work. I

have used my subjects in dark and lights and earn a new dimension which very few photographers can do in Bangladesh. I always emphasis the dimension based lightings. Such kind of exhibition "Studio art" is very first time in Bangladesh.

In my career, I have several national awards in photography contest. I achieved two times Best Photographer award nationally in 2008 & 2010, organised by Bangladesh Parjatan Corporation.

What is your future plan?

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At present, I have been running one of the biggest and well-equipped photography studios - called 'Studio Creations' - in Dhake Hatirpul area, I also run my own photography school there. My future plane developed based on my school, I want to fook after the photography from han institutional point of view. In addition, one day my photography school became an institutional institutional institutional institutional institutional institutional tist my dream future plane too. I always look after Photography from an artistic point of view. Therefore, if anybody wants to come this profession he must know the basics and acculturation with global and national art and heritage. A good photography became history if it indicates something.

Beautiful Bangladesh through the lens

Tourism photography exhibition and competition at Shilpakala

A three-day tourism photography exhibition and competition opened on March 1 at the National Art Gallery of Bangladesh Shilpakala Academy.

Bangladesh Tourism Board, under the supervision of Ministry of Civil Aviation and Tourism, has organised the exhibition, titled "Beautiful Bangladesh". The exhibition was inaugurated by Khorshed Alam Chowdhury, Secretary to the Ministry of Civil Aviation and Tourism.

The subjects of the photographs are diverse: natural beauty, landscape, culture, heritage, rural lifestyle, harvest, food, historical sites, artifacts, river, forest, biodiversity and more of Bangladesh.

The participating photographers took their cameras in search of exquisite images from the Sundarbans to Bandarban, from north-eastern Haor region to St. Martin's Island, from river to forest, from Paharpur to Kantajir Mandir and other parts of Bangladesh. Impassable hills, unfathomable sea, pointed roots of mangrove forest did not appear as impediments to them. Almost all the seasons of Bangladesh have been conspicuously highlighted through the images.

The jury evaluated almost 4,000 entries from 139 contestants and from these, 180 images

by 71 photographers were selected for the exhibition. The best three entries, excluding an honourable mention, will be awarded at the closing programme today (March 3, at 5pm) at the gallery. Col (Retd) Muhammad Faruk Khan, MP will hand over the prize money to the winners: the 1st with Taka 50,000; 2nd with Taka 35,000; 3rd with Taka 20,000 and the honourable mention with Taka 5,000.

MM Zahidur Rhaman Biplob has the largest number of entries at the exhibition, with 13 beautiful images selected. The accomplished photographer is clearly attracted to the natural beauty, landscape and pastoral lifestyle of Bangladesh. Biplob's works feature a cautious deer from the Sundarbans, a spider meticu-

lously weaving a web, the voyage of a bamboo fleet on a narrow creek, a successful kingfisher and more. As white clouds move along dancing with the azure of the sky on an autumnal kashphool river, it not only grips an art connoisseur but also anyone taking a peek.

All these images bring to light many facets of Bangladesh, some overly familiar and some surprisingly underexposed. Among those several images stood out as they captured the magnificence of moments.

And that's not all. Apart from scenic destinations and festivals, the exhibition also includes photos of historic and archaeological sites, indigenous lifestyle, flora and fauna. It is indeed a feast for the eyes.
